It was great to see so many parents, siblings, family and friends enjoying the performances and digital stories and seeing how much the children have developed this year. The individual achievements and cooperative group work was on display for all to see. Congratulations again to all our 100 students (approximately) who are graduating from WAS this year.

It has been a highly productive year and a lot has been achieved. Some of the key highlights of 2018 were the Premier's announcement of \$7.9M to rebuild the Niddrie campus as a state of the art early learning facility; the redevelopment of the Wattle Building to house five purpose built classrooms for early years student including new play ground works at Laverton; \$2.4M for the Autism Teaching Institute to deliver a state wide inclusive practice professional learning program for School Leaders in mainstream schools and regional Student Support Services personnel including new websites for the ATI and the school. Congratulations to all the wonderful staff and to school council for the exceptional outcomes achieved at WAS again this year.

Next year is the final year of our current School Strategic Plan 2016-2019. The final elements of the four year plan will be implemented in the 2019 Annual Implementation Plan. The School Review will take place later next year. An important part of the review are parents' voices in the schools development. The self evaluation process will involve wide consultation with the school community. More input on how you can have input will be available next year.

To you and your families our very best wishes for a happy and safe holiday season. We look forward to hearing how the children moving on from WAS settle into their new schools, and to seeing the children and families who are returning to WAS in the new year.

ATI Graduate Diploma Program – 2018

In Semester 1 2018 we had 23 teachers complete their Graduate Diploma of Teaching Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder. These teachers were each supported in their classrooms by a trainer/assessor. The achievements of these teachers was celebrated at a Graduation Ceremony in November.

In July 2018 a new cohort of students began, with 40 teachers receiving scholarships from DET, and a further 5 from Catholic Education. Of the 40 teachers, 9 are from WAS, and one is currently employed as a Regional Autism and Inclusion Consultant. In 2019 we also have 2 past students returning to join this cohort to complete their studies.

In September 2018 the ATI's new website went live. The website will streamline some administration processes. Further enhancements are underway including the development of Professional Development certificate generating feature, discussion forums, and Alumni client management system.

The ATI are looking forward to an even busier 2019 anticipating further scholarships to be offered for a mid-year intake.
